

Overview

Canadian School Querétaro is Tier 3 school accredited by the Ministry of Education of Alberta. The Canadian School Querétaro is a school community focused on continuous school improvement to ensure all students are successful.

We focus on improving student achievement in literacy, numeracy, the development of 21st Century competencies and the development of ethical citizens.

We have a unique Double Diploma course aligning Alberta Curriculum with SEP where students receive the benefits of both Mexican national curriculum as well as Canada's excellent education system.

The Canadian School Querétaro is located in the beautiful colonial city of Querétaro in the newest developing area of the city. Canadian School Querétaro opened its doors in 2017 with 156 students from Toddlers to Kindergarten. We now have 519 from Toddlers to G6 from which 194 students are from G3 to G6.

The growth is result of the great educational environment and the great sense of community we have created.

We currently have two operating buildings, for Early Years and Elementary; and we are under the construction of a new building because by August 2024 we will open Junior High School with grade 7.

OUTCOME 1:

All students demonstrate growth and achievement in their literacy skills and competencies.

In the 2023 surveys:

- 95% teachers and parents agree that students are engaged in fun and meaningful learning.
 experiences.
- o 91% teachers and parents agree that students model the characteristics of The Canadian School Way
- o 86% of students believed that most students help each other.
- o 100% of the students agreed that, at school, they are encouraged to do their best.
- 91% of the grade 4 to 6 students said yes to the question Do you like learning math? (Alberta School Report, Fall 2023)
- Our data also tell us that 98.6% of the students who responded to the survey last year were satisfied with the overall quality of basic education. This percentage is considered very high as it is 10.5% higher than average in Alberta in 2023. (Alberta School Report, Fall 2023)



Students are successful, engaged and supported with staff who are provided opportunities to enhance their professional capacity and leadership within a culture of collaboration.

Students are successful, engaged and supported with a school community that is safe, caring, and inclusive. Students are engaged in a variety of initiatives that create a positive school climate where every person belongs.

- Student Success department is actively involved with teachers and parents to support well-being and success.
- Outsourced psychopedagogical training to allign the Student Success department
- o Weekly meetings with principals to check the advances of students with follow up.
- Culture based on the Canadian School Way that is a daily practice amongst the members of the community.

In the survey:

95% of parents strongly agree that teachers motivate their child.

97% of parents strongly agree that the activities are consistent with the school program.

91% of the parents consider that the Canadian School Way program is applied and they are involved in decisions about their child's education.



OUTCOME 2:

Students are engaged, successful, and supported in their learning when they have access to technology, support and services that foster personalized, relevant and authentic learning.

- Students have access to technology since Early Years in work centers for limited usage time.
- o As thy grow, students increase the use of devices according to grade level
- o Grades 4-6 have the 1:1 Ipad program
- o Grade 7 will receive a MacBook pro
- o All the classrooms are equiped with projectors
- Innovation Center has a wide range of tools and materials where students create and innovate. This year some students participated in an external Robotic Contest.





Students are successful, engaged and supported with a school that promotes and values opportunities for parents and the community to work collaboratively in partnerships to support student success.

- Survey shows that parents consider that the Canadian School Way program is applied, and they are involved in decisions about their child's education.
- Parents are engaged with school in diverse activities that impact the outside community: Toys for underprivileged kids, food for a foster home, Art Auction where the earnings go to support Educational Institutions with low resources.
- Visit from parents or family members to share special activities that support the learning process.

OUTCOME 2:
